



It is a program that provides local schools in lowincome areas with an alternative approach for operating the school meal program.

With the CEP program the school does not need to collect lunch applications for free or reduced meals from <u>qualifying schools</u>, instead will use other means including the supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Temporary Assistance Program for Needy Families (TANF) to determine the level of Federal funding for the school meal program. <u>This is why it is very</u> <u>important for families to apply for</u> <u>assistance if you feel you may qualify and to</u> <u>report it to the school lunch program if you</u> <u>qualify by filling out a lunch application.</u>





- ✓ Allows schools located in low-income areas to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students
- ✓ Eliminates the burden to collecting household applications to determine eligibility for school meal programs

✓ Parents


No application for qualifying school
